

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF VALENCIA WATER CONTROL DISTRICT

June 14, 2022

The annual meeting of the Board of Supervisors of VALENCIA WATER CONTROL DISTRICT was held at 1:10 P.M. on Tuesday, June 14, 2022, at the Lake Ridge Village Clubhouse, 10630 Larissa Street, Orlando, Florida. Physically present were Supervisors Roy Miller, Debra Donton, Von Ingle and Brian Andrelczyk. Also, in attendance were the following: George Flint, District Director, Stephen Broome, District Counsel; David Mahler, District Engineer; Stacie Vanderbilt, District Administrative Assistant; and Dan Brown, Sthern Environmental.

ITEM #1

Call Meeting to Order

Mr. Flint called the meeting to order at 1:10 P.M. A quorum of four Board members were present.

ITEM #2

Public Comment Period

No members of the public were present to provide comment.

ITEM #3

Administer Oath of Office to Newly Elected Supervisor

Mr. Broome administered the Oath of Office to Mr. Roy Miller.

ITEM #4

Acceptance of Resignation of Ed Neal and Appointment of Individual to Fulfill the Board Vacancy with a Term Ending November 2024

Mr. Flint stated Mr. Neal has resigned due to no longer being Manager of Westwood Lakes POA, and the current Manager Ms. Amanda Whitney would like to be considered for the vacant position. She is an Orange County resident and will verify ownership in the District.

Mr. Miller stated he met with Waterview HOA President and an Orange County Engineer to clean the ditch by the clubhouse and they said they will clean it up. He stated she was very confused by the ownership of the Clubhouse maintained area.

B. Consideration of Irrigation Permit #0522 - Savoia/Somerset Village

Mr. Flint stated the District allows for resident irrigation systems to be installed in certain waterways subject to availability and conditions accepted.

Mr. Flint stated the owner will have to get other required approvals. The property the District owns is minimal.

ITEM #17 Other Business


