

## SECTION III

## MINUTES OF THE MONTHLY MEETING OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF VALENCIA WATER CONTROL DISTRICT

#### **September 13, 2022**

The monthly meeting of the Board of Supervisors of VALENCIA WATER CONTROL DISTRICT was held at 1:00 P.M. on Tuesday, September 13, 2022, at the Lake Ridge Village Clubhouse, 10630 Larissa Street, Orlando, Florida. Physically present were Supervisors Roy Miller, Von Ingle, Debra Donton, and Brian Andrelczyk. Also, in attendance were the following: George Flint, District Director; Stephen Broome, District Counsel; David Mahler, District Engineer; Stacie Vanderbilt, District Administrative Assistant; and Dan Brown, Sthern Environmental; Several Residents.

#### ITEM #1

#### Call Meeting to Order

Mr. Flint called the meeting to order at 1:00 P.M. A quorum of three Board Members were present.

#### **ITEM #2**

#### **Public Comment Period**

Donna Finklestein (Greenbriar) stated that several months ago a Williamsburg resident wrote an article about the additional signage the District installed regarding no fishing. The author of the article advised that no one on the Board could say who they've witnessed fishing in the ponds and felt that the residents should be issued lanyards to allow them to fish or boat in the ponds. She requested the District write an article refuting the resident's claims.

Mr. Flint stated his opinion of the article was it was more like an editorial, which is an opinion not stated on facts. He added that the District is did not input on the article, nor is issuing lanyards.

Mr. Miller stated he spoke to the resident referenced and advised him that the rule wasn't new and it applied to everyone. There was no special treatment for any residents.

Ms. Greenbriar stated this was communicated to the WHOA Board.

Mr. Flint and Mr. Miller advised the District could not get involved in HOA matters.

Liz Norfolk stated the District should write a strongly worded letter to the resident and it may stop him.

#### **ITEM #3**

### Administer Oath of Office to Newly Elected Supervisor

Mr. Broome administered the Oath of Office to Ms. Whitney.

#### **ITEM #4**

#### Approval of August 9, 2022 Minutes

Mr. Flint stated the next item was the minutes from the August 9, 2022 monthly meeting. He asked if there were any corrections, deletions, or additions.

On MOTION by Roy Miller, seconded by Von Ingle, with all in favor the Minutes from the August 9, 2022 Monthly Meeting were approved as presented.

#### **ITEM #5**

#### **General Fund Financial Reports**

Mr. Flint reviewed the August financial statements with the Board and noted that everything was in shape, and they are about 99% collected on assessments.

#### **ITEM #6**

#### **Engineer's Report**

#### A. Approval of Permit #0523 – Orchid Bay – Extended Stay America

Mr. Mahler stated there is a master stormwater for the property and he had to make sure their site fits with the master plan. He recommended approval.

On MOTION by Roy Miller, seconded by Brian Andrelczyk, with all in favor Permit #0523 – Orchid Bay – Extended Stay America, was approved.

#### **ITEM #7**

#### Attorney's Report

Mr. Broome stated there is nothing new other than reviewing the temporary access easement that was added.

#### **ITEM #8**

#### **Director's Report**

#### A. Customer Call Log

Mr. Flint reviewed the log with the Board. He stated there was flooding in the street and parking lot of the Lime Tree clubhouse, the issue is with Orange County and not the District. They

received a call on Friday from a resident advising of a fish kill and explained that it's a natural occurrence usually weather related. He stated that after reviewing the area, this was the case in this instance and the fish were picked up yesterday by staff.

He added that there were additional calls not included in the log: a request for lily pad treatment on Deer Creek Pond #4 by a resident that was reported to aquatic, and trash reported in the Parkview Pointe Pond by the HOA manager that was passed along to Dan.

#### B. Consideration of Temporary Access Easement Agreement - Added

Mr. Flint reviewed the agreement with the Board. He advised that a homeowner is building a pool at their house and that they back up to one of the District's ponds. As a result, the District recommends issuing this agreement to protect the District if any property is damaged.

Mr. Broome added we need to change some of the language like the term being linked to the commencement of the project, he was not sure 90 days is enough time.

Mr. Flint responded usually we don't want to link it just to the commencement date because the project may not start within that time. He suggested adding language advising the term can be extended upon written consent from both parties.

Mr. Miller explained to the Board the details of the project and what the resident intends to do.

On MOTION by Roy Miller, seconded by Von Ingle, with all in favor the Temporary Access Easement Agreement with Abdelilah Fahsi was approved subject to changing the terms to 120 days and including extensions could be made upon written consent from both parties.


