# **MINUTES**

#### MINUTES OF THE MONTHLY MEETING OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF VALENCIA WATER CONTROL DISTRICT

#### September 9, 2025

The monthly meeting of the Board of Supervisors of VALENCIA WATER CONTROL DISTRICT was held at 1:00 P.M. on Tuesday, September 9, 2025, at the Lake Ridge Village Clubhouse, 10630 Larissa Street, Orlando, Florida. Physically present were Supervisors Roy Miller, Debra Donton, Achal Aggarwal, William Von Ingle, and Bill Argus. Also, in attendance were the following: George Flint, District Director; Stephen Broome, District Counsel; Stacie Vanderbilt, District Administrative Assistant; David Mahler, District Engineer; Dan Brown, Sthern Environmental; and Robert Szozda, GMS-CF.

#### **ITEM #1**

#### **Call Meeting to Order**

Mr. Flint called the meeting to order at 1:00 P.M. A quorum of five Board members were present.

#### **Approval of June 30, 2025 Minutes**

Mr. Flint stated the next item was the minutes from the June 30, 2025 meeting. He asked for any corrections. There being none,

On MOTION by Mr. Aggarwal, seconded by Ms. Donton, with all in favor the Minutes from the June 30, 2025 Monthly Meeting, were approved, as presented.

#### **ITEM #4**

#### **General Fund Financial Reports**

Mr. Flint went through the financials with the Board. We went over a little on prorated items for Engineering, Canal Maintenance, and Tree Trimming projects. The transfer to the Capital Reserve was done.

Mr. Aggarwal asked how can we collect more than 100% of assessments?

Mr. Flint explained we have to gross up the assessments for early collections.

#### **ITEM #5**

#### **Engineer's Report**

## A. Review of Bid Tabulation and Approval of Contract Agreement for C-10 Canal Bank Restoration

Mr. Flint reminded the Board that the project was previously bid out and had to be rejected due to only receiving one response that was over budget.

Mr. Mahler advised the Board on all the bids that were received when they asked for pricing. He walked the property with the lone bidder D.O.S. Services. The bid tabulation was including in the agenda and he recommended awarding to D.O.S.

Mr. Von Ingle asked why there was such a large gap in pricing from D.O.S. against the other bidders?

Mr. Mahler replied he has low overhead compared to other larger companies.

On MOTION by Ms. Donton, seconded by Mr. Argus, with all in favor the Contract Agreement for C-10 Canal Bank Restoration with D.O.S. Services, was approved.

Mr. Broome had nothing new to report to the Board.

#### **ITEM #7**

#### **Director's Report**

#### A. Customer Call Log

Mr. Flint reviewed the log with the Board. Parkview Point residents complained about No Trespassing signs. We installed one in the right of way by the street so residents on either side couldn't complain. Other residents wanted signs in their yard, but the District couldn't do that. Mr. Vincent's items referred to the HOA owned wetland having a homeless person camp. His tree was also trimmed. Dan Brown and the team received a compliment for mowing.

## B. Ratification of Proposal from Aquatic Management Strategies, Inc. for Hydrilla Treatments

Mr. Flint stated I approved this work and it needs to be ratified.

On MOTION by Mr. Miller, seconded by Mr. Aggarwal, with all in favor the Proposal from Aquatic Management Strategies, Inc. for Hydrilla Treatments, was ratified.

#### ITEM #8 Other Business

Mr. Miller asked what is going on with Big Sand Lake?

Mr. Flint responded we haven't heard from the representatives since their presentation.

Mr. Mahler stated there was a combination of construction plus steady rains that may have

raised the levels to begin with. Once the I-4 Ultimate construction and 528 construction completed and the rain being less this year, helped lower the levels.

Mr. Miller stated the pipe that they are taking over the Orangewood bridge, how long will that take? Someone said February.

Mr. Mahler stated I will have to get the work schedule and see what it says. I will get it to GMS.

Mr. Miller stated the top of the C-1 Canal vegetation needs to be treated.

Mr. Flint stated I asked the vendor to treat it and will follow up.

SeaWorld Orlando is hereby granted a construction permit related to the Project Neptune building and supporting infrastructure. Approval is granted in accordance with approved plans and hydraulic calculations and the following GENERAL AND SPECIFIC CONDITIONS:

#### **GENERAL CONDITIONS:**

- 1. That the District or their agents may at any time make such inspections as they may deem necessary to ensure that the construction or work is performed in accordance with the conditions of this permit.
- 2. That the permittee will maintain the work authorized herein during construction and thereafter in good condition in accordance with the approved plans.
- 3. That the permittee shall comply promptly with any lawful regulations, conditions, or instructions affecting the structure or work authorized herein if and when issued by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, the South Florida Water Management District and the Florida Department of Environmental Protection and/or any county or city environmental protection agency having jurisdiction to abate or prevent water pollution, including thermal or radiation pollution. Such regulations, conditions, or instructions in effect or hereafter prescribed by the federal, state, county and city agencies have hereby made a condition of this permit.
- It is understood and agreed that the rights and privileges herein set out are granted only to 4. the extent of the District's right, title and interest in the land to be entered upon and used by the permittee, and the permittee will at all times, assume all risk and indemnify, defend and save harmless Valencia Water Control District from and against any and all loss, damage, cost or expense arising in any manner on account of the exercise or attempted exercises by the permittee of the aforesaid rights and privileges.

- 5. The permittee and/or their agents will use every measure to prevent the run-off of turbid water into the District's facilities including, but not limited to, the use of temporary ponds, silt barriers, chemical additives and temporary grassing during construction.
- 6. If discharge of water by permittee should at any time raise the level of pollutants in the District's water management facility to the point where the District is in violation of a statute or regulation, permittee will either: (a) immediately cease such discharge, (b) remove pollutants from the water before discharging into District facilities, and pay all costs which the District must incur in order to reduce pollution in the District's facilities to acceptable levels.
- 7. That all the provisions of this permit shall be binding on any assignee or successor in interest of the permittee.
- 8. That any modification, suspension or revocation of this permit shall not be the basis for a claim for damages against Valencia Water Control District.
- 9. The Valencia Water Control District agrees that the issuance of this permit allows the passage of water through their canals but in so doing does not assume any responsibility for damage to any persons or property.
- 10. That the engineer of record certify that the facilities as constructed comply with the submitted hydraulic calculations and approved drawings.
- 11. That the permittee agrees not to modify or alter the constructed facilities at any future time without the express consent of the District.
- 12. This permit is valid for 3 years from date of approval or runs concurrently with the SFWMD permit, if required, whichever expires first.
- 13. That this permit must be executed within 30 days of Board approval or must be brought back to the Board for reconsideration.

#### **END OF GENERAL CONDITIONS**

STORM DRAINAGE SYSTEM SHALL BE CLEANED AND FREE OF DEBRIS PRIOR TO OWNER'S ACCEPTANCE.
- 3. PROVIDE SOCK DRAIN IN FRONT OF ALL DRAINAGE CURB INLETS AND PROVIDE FILTER FABRIC UNDER THE GRATE OF ALL DITCH BOTTOM INLETS AFTER INITIAL COMPLETION OF THE DRAINAGE STRUCTURES. MAINTAIN THESE MEASURES DAILY (WHICH MAY INCLUDE FULL REPLACEMENT AT THE DISCRETION OF THE OWNER'S REPRESENTATIVE) TO MINIMIZE SILT ACCUMULATION IN THE STORM DRAINAGE SYSTEM. INLET PROTECTION TYPES PROPOSED ARE NOT VERY ROBUST. BMPs ARE PERFORMANCE BASED, THEREFORE IF BMPs PROPOSED ARE NOT FUNCTIONING PROPERLY IN THE FIELD TO CONTROL SEDIMENT/POLLUTANT THAN ALTERNATE BMPs MUST BE USED TO REPLACE THE NON-PERFORMING BMPs.
- 4. IN ADDITION TO THE REQUIREMENTS IN THE ENGINEER'S SPECIFICATIONS, ALL DRAINAGE SYSTEM CONSTRUCTION SHALL BE COMPLETED IN ACCORDANCE WITH ORANGE COUNTY ROAD CONSTRUCTION SPECIFICATIONS.

- 7. ALL DRAINAGE PIPE JOINTS SHALL BE WRAPPED WITH FILTER FABRIC CLOTH PER FDOT INDEX #430-001.

### UTILITIES:

- WATER, WASTEWATER AND RECLAIM UTILITIES TO BE COMPLETED IN ACCORDANCE WITH ORANGE COUNTY UTILITIES STANDARDS AND CONSTRUCTION SPECIFICATIONS MANUAL, OCTOBER 10, 2021 EDITION WITH AUGUST 23, 2021 REVISIONS.
- 2. ALL EXISTING UTILITIES HAVE BEEN FIELD VERIFIED AT ALL POINTS OF CONNECTION TO AND ALL AREAS OF CONFLICT WITH OCU MAINS. CONTRACTOR SHALL FIELD RE-VERIFY LOCATION AND ELEVATION OF ALL EXISTING UTILITIES PRIOR TO CONSTRUCTION. ANY SIGNIFICANT DEVIATIONS SHALL BE BROUGHT TO THE ENGINEER'S ATTENTION.
- 3. WHERE APPLICABLE, CONSTRUCT THE UTILITY MAINS PARALLEL TO THE ROADWAY BASELINE/CENTERLINE AND TO EACH OTHER IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE STATIONS AND OFFSETS AND/OR TYPICAL SECTIONS SHOWN ON THE DRAWINGS. PROVIDE ADDITIONAL BENDS AS NECESSARY IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE MANUFACTURER'S RECOMMENDATION.
- 4. PROTECT THE UTILITY SYSTEMS AT ALL TIMES DURING CONSTRUCTION. SHOULD A SYSTEM BECOME DAMAGED, ALTERED OR EXTENDED AFTER THE INITIAL TESTING, THE AFFECTED PORTION OF THE SYSTEM SHALL BE RESTORED AS NECESSARY AND RETESTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROJECT SPECIFICATIONS.

VERTICAL SEPARATION BETWEEN UNDERGROUND WATER MAINS AND SANITARY OR STORM SEWERS, WASTEWATER OR STORM WATER FORCE MAINS, AND RECLAIMED WATER PIPELINES.

- A. NEW OR RELOCATED, UNDERGROUND WATER MAINS CROSSING ANY EXISTING OR PROPOSED GRAVITY- OR VACUUM-TYPE SANITARY SEWER OR STORM SEWER SHALL BE LAID SO THE OUTSIDE OF THE WATER MAIN IS AT LEAST 6 INCHES AND PREFERABLY 12 INCHES, ABOVE OR AT LEAST 12 INCHES BELOW THE OUTSIDE OF THE OTHER PIPELINE. HOWEVER, IT IS PREFERABLE TO LAY THE WATER MAIN ABOVE THE OTHER PIPELINE.
- B. HOWEVER, IT IS PREFERABLE TO LAY THE WATER MAIN ABOVE THE OTHER PIPELINE.
- C. AT THE UTILITY CROSSINGS DESCRIBED IN PARAGRAPHS (A) AND (B), ABOVE, ONE FULL LENGTH OF WATER MAIN PIPE SHALL BE CENTERED ABOVE OR BELOW THE OTHER PIPELINE SO THE WATER MAIN JOINTS WILL BE AS FAR AS POSSIBLE FROM THE OTHER PIPELINE. ALTERNATIVELY, AT SUCH CROSSINGS, THE PIPES SHALL BE ARRANGED SO THAT ALL WATER MAIN JOINTS ARE AT LEAST THREE FEET FROM ALL JOINTS IN VACUUM-TYPE SANITARY SEWERS, STORM SEWERS, STORMWATER FORCE MAINS, OR PIPELINES CONVEYING RECLAIMED WATER REGULATED UNDER PART III OF CHAPTER 62-610, F.A.C., AND AT LEAST SIX FEET FROM ALL JOINTS IN GRAVITY- OR PRESSURE-TYPE SANITARY SEWERS, WASTEWATER FORCE MAINS, OR PIPELINES CONVEYING RECLAIMED WATER NOT REGULATED UNDER PART III OF CHAPTER 62-610, F.A.C.
- SEPARATION BETWEEN WATER MAINS AND SANITARY OR STORM SEWER MANHOLES.

  A. NO WATER MAIN SHALL PASS THROUGH, OR COME INTO CONTACT WITH, ANY PART OF A SANITARY SEWER MANHOLE.
- 6. AT EACH UTILITY SERVICE STUB OUT AND/OR UTILITY SLEEVE LOCATION, PROVIDE A 4"X4"X8' (4' DEEP) WOOD POST COLOR CODED AND MARKED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE FOLLOWING TABLE WHILE ALSO COMPLYING WITH THE ORANGE COUNTY UTILITY STANDARDS AND CONSTRUCTION SPECIFICATION MANUAL. PROVIDE HORIZONTAL LOCATION AND INVERT ELEVATIONS OF ALL STUB OUTS AND LATERALS AS PART OF THE RECORD DRAWINGS.

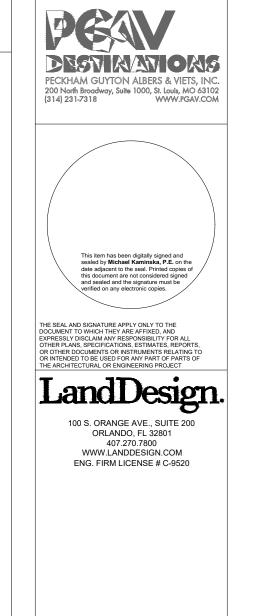

OCU FACILITIES TO BE ADJUSTED INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO; PIPELINES, PUMP STATIONS, VALVE BOXES, AIR RELEASE VALVES, FIRE HYDRANTS, MANHOLE COVERS, AND METERS. ALL ADJUSTMENTS SHALL BE MADE TO CURRENT STANDARDS.
- 8. ONLY OCU PERSONNEL SHALL OPERATE EXISTING OCU WATER, WASTEWATER, AND RECLAIMED WATER VALVES. THE CONTRACTOR IS RESPONSIBLE FOR OPERATING ANY NEWLY INSTALLED VALVE THAT HAS NOT BEEN CLEARED FOR USAGE BY FDEP AND OCU. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL COORDINATE VALVE OPERATION WITH THE OCU INSPECTOR. FOR OPERATION OF MAINS NOT OWNED BY OCU, IT IS THE CONTRACTOR'S RESPONSIBILITY TO COORDINATE WITH THE APPROPRIATE UTILITY REPRESENTATIVE.
- 9. CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES SHALL NOT CAUSE INTERRUPTIONS IN WATER, WASTEWATER, OR RECLAIMED WATER SERVICE. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL COORDINATE PRE-APPROVED INTERRUPTIONS OF SERVICE WITH THE OCU INSPECTOR 7 WORKING DAYS IN ADVANCE AND WRITTEN NOTICE SHALL BE GIVEN TO AFFECTED CUSTOMERS AT LEAST 4 WORKING DAYS IN ADVANCE.
- 10. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL PROVIDE FOR BYPASSING AND / OR HAULING OF WASTEWATER DURING APPROVED INTERRUPTIONS OF WASTEWATER FLOWS AND CONNECTIONS. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL SUBMIT A BYPASS OR HAUL PLAN, REVIEWED AND APPROVED BY A PROFESSIONAL ENGINEER TO OCU DEVELOPMENT ENGINEERING AND TO THE INSPECTOR FOR APPROVAL PRIOR TO IMPLEMENTATION BY CONTRACTOR.
- 11. ALL VALVES INSTALLED AS PART OF THIS CONSTRUCTION PROJECT SHALL REMAIN CLOSED DURING CONSTRUCTION. KEEP VALVES ON ALL WET TAPS CLOSED UNTIL CLEARED BY FDEP. DO NOT CONNECT NEWLY CONSTRUCTED WATER MAINS TO ANY EXISTING WATER MAINS UNLESS CLEARED BY FDEP AND OCU.
- 12. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL PROVIDE A JUMPER ASSEMBLY WITH AN APPROVED BACKFLOW PREVENTER FOR MAKING TEMPORARY CONNECTIONS TO AN EXISTING POTABLE WATER SOURCE IN ORDER TO CHLORINATE AND FLUSH NEW WATER MAINS WITH POTABLE WATER. ANY TEMPORARY POTABLE WATER CONNECTIONS TO RECLAIMED WATER OR FORCE MAIN SHALL ALSO BE EQUIPPED WITH AN APPROVED BACKFLOW PREVENTER.
- 13. FOR PVC PIPE, NO JOINT DEFLECTION OR PIPE BENDING IS ALLOWED. ALIGNMENT CHANGE SHALL BE MADE ONLY WITH FITTINGS.
- 14.FOR DIP PIPE, LONG RADIUS CURVES, EITHER HORIZONTAL OR VERTICAL, MAY BE INSTALLED WITH STANDARD PIPE BY DEFLECTIONS AT THE JOINTS. MAXIMUM DEFLECTIONS AT PIPE JOINTS, FITTINGS AND LAYING RADIUS FOR THE VARIOUS PIPE LENGTHS SHALL NOT EXCEED 75 PERCENT OF THE PIPE MANUFACTURER'S RECOMMENDATION.
- 15. FOR APPROVED PVC OR HDPE PIPE USED IN A HORIZONTAL DIRECTIONAL DRILL INSTALLATION, THE CURVATURE AND/OR DEFLECTION SHALL NOT EXCEED THE PARAMETERS ESTABLISHED IN THIS MANUAL.
- 16. ALL DAMAGE TO ORANGE COUNTY INFRASTRUCTURE, PIPELINES, AND ASSETS SHALL BE REPAIRED IMMEDIATELY BY THE CONTRACTOR AT THE CONTRACTOR'S EXPENSE WITH AN APPROVED METHOD BY THE COUNTY. IF THE REPAIR IS NOT PERFORMED IN A TIMELY MANNER, AS DETERMINED BY THE ORANGE COUNTY UTILITY INSPECTOR, ORANGE COUNTY MAY PERFORM REPAIRS AND THE CONTRACTOR WILL BE CHARGED FOR ALL EXPENSES ASSOCIATED WITH THE REPAIR.
- 17. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL BE LIABLE FOR ANY AND ALL SANITARY SEWER OVERFLOWS (SSO) ASSOCIATED WITH THE WORK, REGARDLESS OF FAULT. THE CONTRACTOR WILL BE ASSESSED PENALTIES FOR ANY AND EACH SSO AS SPECIFIED IN SECTION 3110. GENERAL CONSTRUCTION REQUIREMENTS.

## NON-AD VALOREM ASSESSMENT ADMINISTRATION AGREEMENT

An AGREEMENT made this 1st day of October 2025 between AMY MERCADO as Orange County Property Appraiser (Property Appraiser) and, Valencia Water Control District (Taxing Authority), and is effective upon acceptance by both parties and through, September 30, 2026.

- 1. The Taxing Authority desires to use the services of the Property Appraiser to maintain non-ad valorem assessments on the tax roll and the Property Appraiser is prepared to do so, on behalf of the Taxing Authority. Each party represents that it has satisfied all conditions precedent to enter into this agreement.
- 2. The Property Appraiser agrees to perform the following service for the Taxing Authority:
  - A. Create a Non-Ad Valorem Assessment Roll for the Taxing Authority for the 2026 tax roll year using data provided annually to the Property Appraiser's Office by the Taxing Authority per attached Calendar for Implementation of Non- Ad Valorem Assessment Roll.
  - B. Provide the Taxing Authority with a data file in a compatible format on or before April 1, containing all parcels within the boundaries of the Taxing Authority to be used for the Taxing Authority's planning purposes in establishing its non-ad valorem assessments.
  - C. Receive from the Taxing Authority its proposed or adopted non-ad valorem assessment levy for each type of property and apply that amount to each parcel of real property as stipulated by Taxing Authority.
  - D. Include the Taxing Authority's non-ad valorem assessments on the Notice of Proposed Property Taxes and Proposed or Adopted Non-Ad Valorem Assessments mailed to all property owners in August of each year.
  - E. Receive from the Taxing Authority, corrections or changes to the roll and update the Non-Ad Valorem Assessment Roll for tax bills on or before September 15 of each year, the statutory deadline for certification of non-ad valorem assessments.
  - F. Deliver the Taxing Authority's Non-Ad Valorem Assessment Roll to the Orange County Tax Collector's Office so that tax bills mailed on or about November 1 will include the Taxing Authority's non-ad valorem assessment levies.
- 3. Taxing Authority agrees to perform the following acts in connection with this agreement:

- A. Advise the property owners within the Taxing Authority in an appropriate and lawful manner of the Taxing Authority's intention to utilize the Uniform non- ad valorem assessment method described in Sections 197.3631 through 197.3635, Florida Statutes, and any other applicable Florida statute, and carry out its responsibilities under said sections.
- B. Timely provide the Property Appraiser with information required to prepare the Uniform Non-Ad Valorem Assessment Roll per the Calendar for Implementation of Non-Ad Valorem Assessment Roll.
- C. Advise the property owners within the Taxing Authority as appropriate that the Property Appraiser's office is acting in a ministerial capacity for the Taxing Authority in connection with the non-ad valorem assessments.
- D. Preparation and delivery of certificate of corrections directly to Tax Collector, with copy to Property Appraiser, for any corrections to a certified final tax roll.
- 4. The Taxing Authority shall use its best efforts in furnishing the Property Appraiser with upto-date and accurate data concerning its boundaries, proposed assessments, and other information as requested from time to time by the Property Appraiser and necessary to facilitate his making the assessment in question. The Property Appraiser shall, using the information provided by the Taxing Authority, place the district's non-ad valorem assessments, as made from time to time and certified to him, on properties within the district.
- 5. The Property Appraiser shall be compensated by the Taxing Authority for the administrative costs incurred in carrying out this Agreement. These costs include, but are not limited to labor, printing, forms, office supplies, computer equipment usage, postage, programming, or any other associated costs.
- 6. On 1st day of October of each applicable year, the administrative fee will be invoiced to the Taxing Authority equivalent to \$0 per parcel assessed with a non-ad valorem tax. Parcel counts supporting the invoiced fee will be determined based upon the most current certified non-ad valorem assessment roll. Any new assessments added to the tax roll that were not previously certified and invoiced an administrative fee, will be separately invoiced on or around July 15 and prior to mailing of the Notice of Proposed Property Taxes in August.
- 7. The specific duties to be performed under this agreement and their respective timeframes are contained in the Calendar for Implementation of Non-Ad Valorem Assessment Roll, which is incorporated herein by reference.
- 8. This agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and can only be modified in writing and signed by both parties.

- 9. All parts of this Agreement not held unenforceable for any reason shall be given full force and effect.
- 10. All communications required by this agreement shall be in writing and sent by first class mail, email, or facsimile to the other party.

- 11. TERMINATION. This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon written notice. Property Appraiser will perform no further work after the written termination notice is received.
- 12. TERM. This Agreement shall continue until such time as either party terminates the Agreement pursuant to Paragraph 11, above.
- 13. GOVERNING LAW; VENUE. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Florida. Any action to interpret or enforce any provision of this Agreement shall be brought in the State and Federal courts for Orange County, Florida.

### CALENDAR FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF NON-AD VALOREM ASSESSMENTS

On or about April 1st, Property Appraiser to provide the Taxing Authority with an electronic file that includes parcel ID and any other information applicable or requested. Taxing Authority may request this file at any time after January 1st, but must understand that many splits/ combos, annexations, etc., may not be reflected early in the tax year and subsequent files may be necessary. If any additional information is required at any time by Taxing Authority, it should be requested of the Property Appraiser by Taxing Authority, allowing for a reasonable turnaround time. The file shall be in an ascii file, text or excel file, unless another format is requested and agreed upon between parties.

### June 1

Property Appraiser distributes Best Estimate of Taxable Value to all Taxing Authorities.

### July 1

• Property Appraiser certifies Preliminary tax roll to all taxing authorities.

 Taxing Authority reviews all assessments and provides final approval for Notice of Proposed Property Taxes (TRIM)

### July 15

 Property Appraiser to invoice Administrative Fee for new parcels, if any, assessed and in excess of prior year certified non-ad valorem assessment roll parcel count.

### August 4

• The Taxing Authority adopts its proposed millage rate and submits to the Property Appraiser for TRIM.

### August 24

• Last day Property Appraiser can mail TRIM notices to all property owners on the tax roll.

### September 3 – October 3

• Taxing Authority holds initial and final public budget hearing.

### September 15

• Taxing Authority certifies final non-ad valorem assessment roll to Property Appraiser on or before September 15 with any changes, additions, or deletions to the non-ad valorem assessment roll since the TRIM notices.

### October

- Property Appraiser to mail Non-Ad Valorem Assessment Administration Agreement and invoice for non-ad valorem assessment processing for subsequent tax roll, based upon most recent certified non-ad valorem assessment roll parcel count.
- Property Appraiser delivers the Taxing Authority non-ad valorem assessment roll to the Tax Collector for collection of taxes on November 1 tax bills.

# TEMPORARY ACCESS EASEMENT AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE VALENCIA WATER CONTROL DISTRICT AND W.A. CHESTER

Valencia Water Control District, a local unit of special-purpose government established pursuant to Chapter 289, Florida Statutes, being situated in Orange, County, Florida, and whose mailing address is 219 East Livingston Street, Orlando, Florida 32801 (the "District"); and

**W.A.** Chester, whose mailing address is 4200 Parliament Place, #400, Lanham, Maryland 20706 (the "Project Contractor").

### **WITNESSETH**

**WHEREAS**, the District was established pursuant to Chapter 289, Florida Statutes, by a Decree of the Circuit Court in and for Orange County, Florida, (the "Decree") and is validly existing under the Constitution and laws of the State of Florida; and

**WHEREAS,** the District is the owner of certain lands in Orange County, Florida, more particularly described as Parcel ID 13-24-28-5844-00-950 (the "District Property"); and

WHEREAS, the Project Contractor is working on property within the District having a property description of Avenida Vista, as recorded in the Records of Orange County, Florida (Parcel ID 13-24-28-5844-00-950) (the "Project Contractor's Site"); and

WHEREAS, The Project Contractor has requested that the District grant to them a temporary, nonexclusive easement over a portion of the District Property for the purpose of ingress/egress staging vehicles and equipment, and the District is agreeable to granting such an easement on the terms and conditions set forth herein; and

**WHEREAS**, the portion of District Property over which the temporary easement (the "Easement Property") is requested is shown on **Exhibit A**, attached hereto and made a part hereof.

- **NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the sum of Ten and 00/100 Dollars (\$10.00) and other good and valuable consideration and the mutual covenants of the parties, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties hereby agree as follows:
- 1. **RECITALS.** The foregoing recitals are true and correct and by this reference are incorporated as a material part of this Easement Agreement.
- **2. GRANT OF EASEMENT.** The District hereby grants to the Project Contractor a temporary, non-exclusive easement over, upon, under, through, and across the Easement Property

for the sole purpose of the Project Contractor (and its contractors) ingress/egress, staging of vehicles and equipment (the "Easement"). Project Contractor agrees that the Easement will only be used for ingress/egress, staging vehicles and equipment. No materials shall be placed or stored on the Easement Property. The Project Contractor agrees and acknowledges that, while the District grants access across the Easement Property, as depicted on **Exhibit A**, the District makes no representations or warranties of any kind that Project Contractor has authority to access road right of way or that the Easement Property is suitable for vehicular, or any other, use; the Project Contractor's use of the Easement Property is solely at its own risk. Project Contractor shall be responsible for securing all required approvals and permits from Orange County or any other governmental entity or agency having jurisdiction thereof in connection with their work. Nothing herein shall be interpreted or construed to grant any easement or other rights, temporary or otherwise, over any property other than the Easement Property.

### 4. INDEMNIFICATION.

- a. Project Contractor agrees to indemnify and hold the District harmless from and against any and all damages, losses or claims, including but not limited to legal fees and expenses, to the extent that such damages, losses or claims are attributable to actions, omissions or negligence in the use of the Easement Property by Project Contractor, their employees, agents, assignees, and/or contractors (or their subcontractors, employees, materialmen or independent contractors).
- b. Project Contractor agrees that nothing contained in this Easement Agreement shall constitute or be construed as a waiver of the District's limitations on liability set forth in Section 768.28, Florida Statutes, and other law.
- 5. DAMAGE. In the event that Project Contractor, their respective employees, agents, assignees and/ or contractors (or their subcontractors, employees, materialmen or independent contractors) cause damage to the Easement Property or any of the improvements located within the Easement Property or causes damage to the District's other property or any improvements located thereon, in the exercise of the easement rights granted herein, Project Contractor, at Project Contractor's sole cost and expense, agree to commence and diligently pursue the restoration of the same and the improvements so damaged to as nearly as practical to the original condition and grade, including, without limitation, repair and replacement of any landscaping, hardscaping, plantings, ground cover, irrigation systems, roadways, driveways, sidewalks, parking areas, fences, walks, utility lines, stormwater facilities, pumping facilities, pumps and other structures, within thirty (30) days after receiving written notice of the occurrence of any such damage. The Project Contractor shall allow no lien to attach to the Easement Property or any improvements located on said property or District's other property arising out of work performed by, for, or on behalf of Project Contractor.

- **6. DEFAULT.** A default by any party under this Easement Agreement shall entitle any other to all remedies available at law or in equity, which may include but not be limited to the right of actual damages, injunctive relief and/or specific performance.
- 7. ENFORCEMENT OF AGREEMENT. In the event that either the District or Project Contractor seek to enforce this Easement Agreement by court proceedings or otherwise, then the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover all fees and costs incurred, including reasonable attorneys' fees and costs for trial, alternative dispute resolution or appellate proceedings.
- **8. NOTICES.** Any notice, demand, consent, authorization, request, approval or other communication that any party is required, or may desire, to give to or make upon the other party pursuant to this Agreement shall be effective and valid only if in writing, signed by the party giving notice and delivered personally to the other parties or sent by express 24-hour guaranteed courier or delivery service or by certified mail of the United States Postal Service, postage prepaid and return receipt requested, addressed to the other party as follows (or to such other place as any party may by notice to the others specify):

Notice shall be deemed given when received, except that if delivery is not accepted, notice shall be deemed given on the date of such non-acceptance. Notices delivered after 5:00 p.m. (at the place of delivery) or on a non-business day shall be deemed received on the next business day. If any time for giving notice would otherwise expire on a non-business day, the notice period shall be extended to the next succeeding business day. Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays recognized by the United States government shall not be regarded as business days. Counsel for the District and counsel for Project Contractor may deliver Notice on behalf of the District and Project Contractor.

9. THIRD PARTIES. This Easement Agreement is solely for the benefit of the formal parties hereto, and no right or cause of action shall accrue upon or by reason, to or for the benefit of any third party not a formal party to this Easement Agreement. Nothing in this Easement expressed or implied is intended or shall be construed to confer upon any person or legal entity other than the parties hereto any right, remedy, or claim under or by reason of this Easement

Agreement or any of the provisions or conditions hereof. The District shall be solely responsible for enforcing its rights under this Easement Agreement against any interfering third party. Nothing contained in this Easement Agreement shall limit or impair the District's right to protect their rights from interference by a third party.

- **10. ASSIGNMENT.** No party may assign, transfer or license all or any portion of its rights under this Easement Agreement without the prior written consent of the other parties.
- 11. CONTROLLING LAW. This Easement Agreement shall be construed, interpreted and controlled according to the laws of the State of Florida.
- 12. PUBLIC RECORDS. Project Contractor understands and agrees that all documents of any kind provided to the District or to District Staff in connection with this Easement Agreement are public records and are to be treated as such in accordance with Florida law.
- 13. SEVERABILITY. The invalidity or unenforceability of any one or more provisions of this Easement Agreement shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining portions of this Easement Agreement, or any part of this Easement Agreement not held to be invalid or unenforceable.
- 14. BINDING EFFECT. This Easement Agreement and all of the provisions, representations, covenants, and conditions contained herein shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and permitted assigns.
- **15. AUTHORIZATION.** By execution below, the undersigned represent that they have been duly authorized by the appropriate body or official of their respective entity to execute this Easement Agreement, and that each party has complied with all the requirements of law and has full power and authority to comply with the terms and provisions of this instrument.
- **16. AMENDMENTS.** Amendments to and waivers of the provisions contained in this Easement Agreement may be made only by an instrument in writing which is executed by all parties hereto.
- 17. ENTIRE AGREEMENT. This instrument shall constitute the final and complete expression of the agreement between the parties relating to the subject matter of this Easement Agreement.
